To mark the 900th anniversary of the founding of Hyde Abbey and the re-burial of the bones of King Alfred the Great in 1110.

Join in the solemnity (and the frivolity) along with King Henry 1, the Bishop of Winchester, the Abbot of Hyde, the Abbess of Nunnaminster as well as monks carrying coffins, men at arms, singing, chanting, drumming and flag-waving.
