NB: Liturgy of the Word with Children is celebrated in the sacristy during the parish centre development.

Organists – please keep registrations for the (Gloria – not during Lent), Psalm and Gospel Acclamation to a minimum.

Cantors and organists – please consider bringing the people in straight away with familiar music (i.e. don't repeat refrains unless absolutely necessary).

1. NB At 10.30am Masses, “**May the Word of God Strengthen Us**” is sung as children are dismissed for their Liturgy of the Word – except Sunday 3rd April (**Family Mass**).
2. Psalm tones – use the tone nearest the refrain setting (not necessarily the one closest to the verses). Look for the same (or related) key signature!
3. The Roman Rite makes no provision for a final hymn, though it has become customary to sing one. An organ voluntary may be played instead – **though not during Lent (except Laetare Sunday!)**.
